BESTWOOD DEVELOPMENT GROUP

Nottinghamshire County Council has this year established a new group, the Bestwood Development Group, to help develop and define a new vision and master plan for the park, with the aim of clear continuity in the management of the site. Amongst those represented on the group are the Winding Engine House Volunteers, the Friends group, Bestwood Village Vision and environmental teaching groups, as well as NCC who chair it, and Councillors from Bestwood St Albans Parish Council, Gedling Borough Council, Ashfield District Council and Nottingham City Council.

PRACTICAL CONSERVATION VOLUNTEERS

Two teams of enthusiastic practical conservation volunteers work regularly with the Rangers – on Mondays and on the third Sunday of each month. These are now at full capacity. WELLBEING WALKS

These monthly gentle 90-minute walks on a Wednesday morning are a fun, free way to invigorate body and mind in lovely countryside surroundings. Friends and family welcome. Dogs on a lead, please. HEDGE LAYING TASTER SESSIONS

These one-day tasters are a very basic introduction to hedge laying skills, suitable for beginners and improvers. This traditional craft is the best way to manage a hedgerow making it stronger, longer-lived and a better home for wildlife. They run on some **Sundays from 10 am to 3 pm**, meeting at Alexandra Lodge. They cost £10.00 per person, and you will need to book in advance. HEDGE LAYING WEEKEND

A comprehensive weekend course from 10 am to 3 pm on Saturday 12 and Sunday 13 January 2013 which covers everything from traditions to tools and techniques: how to start a lay to the finishing touches. Additional supporting materials will be supplied to take away to help develop skills further. It costs £50 per person for the weekend, and you will need to book in advance as places are limited.
