BESTWOOD COLLIERY WINDING ENGINE HOUSE - FREE TOURS

The Winding Engine House dates back to 1876, the heyday of Victorian industrial engineering. It's open **every Saturday morning from 10 am – 12 noon** and August Bank Holiday Monday for drop-in visitors and tours, as well as on event days. However if your group would like to visit at other times the volunteers who look after the building welcome your interest and may well be able to book you in by arrangement with our Heritage Development Officers – their contact details are below.
