BESTWOOD COLLIERY WINDING ENGINE HOUSE – FREE WINTER TOURS

The Winding Engine House and its mighty machinery dates back to 1876, the heyday of Victorian industrial engineering. It's open **every Saturday from 10 am – 12 noon for drop-in visitors and tours,** as well as on event days, with access from the **free** winding engine house car park, off Park Road, Bestwood Village, **NG6 8TQ**. **Note**: the House has previously closed from November to March, but the good news is that the volunteer engineers are continuing Saturday morning opening this winter, good health and weather permitting! If your group would like to visit at other times the volunteers who look after the building welcome your interest and may well be able to book you in by arrangement with our Heritage Development Officers – see contact details below. SATURDAY MORNING COMMUNITY CAFÉ

DYNAMO HOUSE MINI-MINERS – the **first Saturday of each month 10 am – 1 pm** – in or outside the Dynamo House Community Café. Winter dates are:
