BESTWOOD DEVELOPMENT GROUP

Nottinghamshire County Council recently established the Bestwood Development Group, to help develop and define a new vision and master plan for the park, with the aim of clear continuity in the management of the site. Amongst those represented on the group are the Winding Engine House Volunteers, the Friends group, Bestwood Village Vision and environmental teaching groups, as well as NCC who chair it, and Councillors from Bestwood St Albans Parish Council, Gedling Borough Council, Ashfield District Council and Nottingham City Council.

WINDING ENGINE HOUSE RE-OPENS

The Winding Engine House will re-open for drop-in visitors on Easter Saturday, 30 March, and will be open on Saturdays and Bank Holiday Mondays through the spring and summer, from 10 am to 12 noon, with entry free, and car parking nearby.
