BESTWOOD COLLIERY WINDING ENGINE HOUSE

The Winding Engine House dates back to 1876, the heyday of Victorian industrial engineering. Over the winter it's closed to drop-in visitors for essential maintenance. HERITAGE DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS AT THE DYNAMO HOUSE

Our Heritage Development Officers, **Adele Williams and David Amos** are based at the Dynamo House, next door to the Winding Engine House. They started work in 2013 and are funded for two years by the Heritage Lottery Fund
