COMMUNITY CAFÉ AT THE DYNAMO HOUSE OPEN LONGER

Call in for a sit down, cuppa and chat – freshly brewed tea and coffee with excellent home-made cakes – on **Saturdays from 10 am – 12 noon and on event days**. Access is via a flat path from the Winding Engine House car park, off Park Road, Bestwood Village - if you're not into climbing the hills of Bestwood! It is run jointly by the Friends group and Bestwood Village WI, with net profits going to benefit the park and chosen charities. **From May and over the summer**, if volunteers are willing and able, we hope to open **until 1 pm on Saturdays**, and from 2 pm – 4 pm on Sundays for June, July and August.

BESTWOOD COLLIERY WINDING ENGINE HOUSE RE-OPENS

The Winding Engine House dates back to 1876, the heyday of Victorian industrial engineering. It re-opens on **Easter Saturday, 19 April from 10 am – 12 noon** for drop-in visitors and tours and will be open every Saturday and Bank Holiday Mondays over the spring, as well as on some event days. However if your group would like to visit at other times the volunteers who look after the building welcome your interest and may well be able to book you in by arrangement with our Heritage Development Officers – their contact detail are below.

MINING HERITAGE AT THE DYNAMO HOUSE

Our Heritage Development Officers, **Adele Williams and David Amos** are based at the Dynamo House, next door to the Winding Engine House.
