## Sherwood Forest National Nature Reserve

The home to the legend of Robin Hood is 450 acres of ancient Forest including woodland and lowland heath, forms part of Sherwood Forest National nature reserve designated in 2002 by Natural England. The site is also designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Special Area of Conservation due to the sites ecology and the veteran Oaks.

The woodlands, heathland and grassland provide essential habitat supplying food and shelter for a wide variety of animals including insects, birds, bats and other mammals.

The Site is managed and run by the Ranger and Warden team as part Nottinghamshire County Council, who are working towards the sites 10 year management plan to conserve, maintain and improve the biodiversity throughout the forest. As well as managing 350,000 visitors we have throughout the year.

We are always on the lookout for volunteers to come along and help with the management by carrying out an array of conservation and maintenance tasks to ensure that this beautiful forest and its biodiversity and be enjoyed for future generations.
